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Reminder to all parents & guardians

You will be aware that the law requires all parents to ensure their children attend school regularly. Research has shown that children often do not catch up on work missed, which can have serious consequences for their learning and progress, resulting in them not achieving their maximum potential.

The local authority has introduced a system where any pupil who has an attendance of 85% or less with at least 15% unauthorised absence over a 6 week period or 10 consecutive sessions (5days) unauthorised absence will meet the criteria for legal intervention, which could be in the form of a Fixed Penalty Notice.

Schools are obliged to refer to the County Improvement Attendance Officer any pupil that meets either criteria, for action to be considered.

If a Fixed Penalty Notice is issued it is a fine of £60 per parent per child, which must be paid in one payment within 21days, if unpaid a further invoice for £60 per parent per child is issued, both individual invoices would then have to be paid making a total payment of £120 in 28 days.

Failure to pay the total amount within the timescale will result in legal action being taken.

Staff at Fakenham Junior School request that holidays are taken out of school term to ensure that our pupils receive the most from their education, we hope that, as parents, you will support this matter so your children do not miss any opportunities.

As a result of the number of pupils missing education at Fakenham Junior School we now have to refer for the Fixed Penalty Notice for any unauthorised holidays of 5 days.

GROUNDBREAKING RESEARCH INTO PARENTS INVOLVEMENT WITH CHILDREN'S LEARNING WE CAN DO IT MATHS - RESEARCH PROJECT

Mrs Steward, Ms Fairbrother and a group of Year 6 pupils and their parents undertook a research project during the last school year to try and find out how beneficial parents being involved in their children's learning really is. We looked at what had been achieved for both the parents and the children in the work we had done together. This is what we found:

- Parents felt much more confident and skilled supporting their children's maths learning at home
- Parents relationship with their child's learning at home improved
- Children's confidence as maths learners had improved some even liked maths now!
- Children's self-esteem as maths learners had improved they could see that they had made progress in maths
- Children felt confident in their parents' ability to help them with maths learning at home
- Children's achievement in maths had increased

This has helped us to identify what we at FJS need to offer both parents and children to make sure that parent's involvement with their child's learning is really valuable:

- We need to inform and enable parents to acquire the skills to support children's learning, in a relaxed and informal manner
- We need to give parents and pupils the opportunity to practice these skills together in school
- Tea, coffee, squash, cakes and biscuits and resources to use at home are vital!


