Reminder to all parents & guardians

You will be aware that the law requires all parents to ensure their children attend school regularly. Research has shown that children often do not catch up on work missed, which can have serious consequences for their learning and progress, resulting in them not achieving their maximum potential.

The local authority has introduced a system where any pupil who has an attendance of 85% or less with at least 15% unauthorised absence over a 6 week period or 10 consecutive sessions (5 days) unauthorised absence will meet the criteria for legal intervention, which could be in the form of a Fixed Penalty Notice.

Schools are obliged to refer to the County Improvement Attendance Officer any pupil that meets either criteria, for action to be considered.

If a Fixed Penalty Notice is issued it is a fine of £60 per parent per child, which must be paid in one payment within 21 days, if unpaid a further invoice for £60 per parent per child is issued, both individual invoices would then have to be paid making a total payment of £120 in 28 days.

Failure to pay the total amount within the timescale will result in legal action being taken.

Staff at Fakenham Junior School request that holidays are taken out of school term to ensure that our pupils receive the most from their education, we hope that, as parents, you will support this matter so your children do not miss any opportunities.

As a result of the number of pupils missing education at Fakenham Junior School we now have to refer for the Fixed Penalty Notice for any unauthorised holidays of 5 days.

PARENT FORUM

Here we are the Parent Forum! We met on Monday 9th March in Café Scrumptious for our 2nd meeting over coffee and delicious cakes. Those at the Forum meeting brought up several issues:



On the top of everyone's list was the new Headteacher.

Once appointed the Parents Forum were very keen that parents/carers have the opportunity to meet them. They were also concerned that children were also given the opportunity to meet the new Headteacher before September.

In response to this we can report that Adam Mason the new Headteacher is meeting with the Senior Leadership Team very regularly to make plans for September, and to recruit new staff. We will be making a time for Adam Mason to meet with existing parents and with new parents coming in to FJS. Mr Mason has some planned dates during this term when he will be in school and will be meeting with children.

Some concern was expressed about the closure of the swimming pool and parents were not clear about the arrangements in place for swimming.

We can confirm that children in Years 4 and 5 will continue to have swimming lessons at Bircham Swimming Pool as part of the PE curriculum.

Parents expressed concern about the loss of intervention teaching and wondered what would be happening in the future.

As a result of teacher shortage both at FJS and across the county, it was decided that continuity of teaching in the classroom is the priority. For this reason intervention teaching had to be reduced. This is currently in Year 6 and 1-1 for 1 day a week.

Parents had a look at the new Homework Diary which included suggestions put forward at the last

Parents Forum. Parents liked the changes and noted that they particularly appreciate it when teachers include in the Homework Diary a brief description of what children have been learning in the classroom during the week.
